At 211 degrees, water is hot. At 212 degrees, it boils. And with boiling water comes steam.... And with steam, you can power a train.


Over the last several months we have apprised you of the Southern Region's convention pin. The pin was shared with folks at the 109th convention in Baltimore.

The Southern Region is kicking off a fund raiser for the Southern Region members utilizing these pins. Each member of the Southern Region that purchases a pin, can also be entered into a drawing by completing a registration ticket.

The March Travels of the Grand Supervisor of the Flock Around Blue Goose Land

Yes, I have been here and there!

The first excursion was to the **Phoenix/Scottsdale** area on March $7^{th} - 9^{th}$, 2016. ON Monday, March 7^{th} after a super smooth flight and an exasperating visit to the Phoenix car rental location, I finally got to catch the Phoenix Pond folks at the very closing of their lunch meeting.

The Alabama Pond has been on life support for some time and we decided to take a good look at who was still a member, who has departed this world and then begin to rebuild. Several of us put our heads together and began rounding up folks that we knew in the Birmingham area to come learn about Blue Goose. This great group consisted of: Cathy Hester, who is a complete gem, along with Jim Pattillo (another attorney Dwane Hermes put me in touch with), and Crystal Gordon, a real pistol of a marketer. But one cannot forget Estelle Smith, who has been a long time Alabama member, for holding the group together....now we are getting her some help. We hosted a Blue Goose Gala on Tuesday, March 22nd at the Aloft Hotel. We had awesome food and a gathering of 20 folks, of which 4 were Blue Goose members and 8 completed applications to become members, while another 4 asked to take an application and would be filling it out/mailing it along with their dues in the next couple weeks. Alabama is coming alive!!!!!!

Following the Birmingham event, I flew to Atlanta to meet with a group that is organizing the rebirth of the **Georgia Pond.** Wow, what an awesome bunch of enthusiastic folks!!

This group had organized an informational gathering which took place on Thursday, March 24th at the 5 Seasons Brewing location. There was plenty of food, plenty of beverages and a room filled with tons and tons of great fellowship. We believe that we had approximately 70 folks in attendance. After, I gave everyone an introduction to Blue Goose, we asked who wanted to be part of this organization & be initiated. A total of 32 new applicantions were received, along with 4 old members asking to be reinstated. All 36 of these folks took part in the initiation.

The Georgia Puddle is off to a great start. They are going to be working hard to build this Puddle up to a giant Pond with a focus on charity, fellowship & character. They anticipate getting to Pond status at the Southern Region Convention in Savannah,, GA in 2017. 
Did You Know?
