Seeking Help for the 2017-2018 Texas Pond Blue Goose Program Year

Our Blue Goose year of 2016-2017 is rapidly coming to a close. As we wind down this year, we are doing a final push on our charity endeavors, seeking new officers and committee members for the various committees, and we will begin to collect dues for the next Blue Goose year.

Let's discuss the Pond Officers for 2017-2018. Our Pond follows the hierarchy of Grand Nest. What does this mean? The MLG now steps into the great role and class of former MLGs, which we bestow upon them the title of "Past Most Loyal Gander" or "PMLG"! We thank them immensely for leading us through a fantastic year (sometimes two years).
